High Academic Achievement

Staff will be involved in professional development to improve Teaching and Learning in Literacy and Numeracy. Staff will be learning together in a variety of ways (i.e., Professional Learning Days, Staff Meetings, etc.) With the support of Greenbriar's Leadership Committee, teachers will explore and leverage the features of the new School Success site to articulate achievable goals for student improvement. To help staff further engage in modern assessment and evaluation strategies, they will use a new board-supported digital assessment tool and virtual learning environment, D2L's Brightspace.

Lastly, staff will continue to attend learning sessions focussed on deepening mathematical current knowledge for teaching, in the context of Empowering Modern Learners and Equity. Emphasis will be on consolidating students' knowledge of basic facts and operational skills; and providing them with purposeful practice of mathematical concepts.

At Greenbriar we are looking forward to a new and exciting school year!

Parent and Community Engagement

Greenbriar will host an Open House on September 26th, 2019. Student Ambassadors will greet visitors and support the school during this exciting time. In addition, a Settlement Worker will set up an information booth to provide families with details about community services, agencies, programs for newcomer families. for our grade 8 students with details about high school options in Peel and community services available to parents and students.

In addition to the long standing support Greenbriar's Breakfast Club has received from YMCA and their considerable donations of yogurt and cereal, we are happy to announce that this year our Breakfast program will also be supported by PC Children's Charity with their generous donation of \$1,100 dollars. 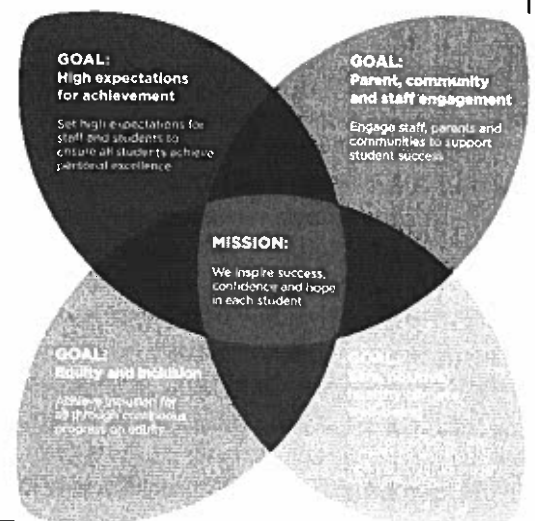

Equity and Inclusion

Our school models inclusion and equity by promoting the integration of students with special education needs to all school activities and events. By leveraging the support of resources such as Teaching Assistants and In School Support Staff, we support students learning in authentic classroom contexts and differentiate instruction to meet the diverse needs of our students. This year, Greenbriar will continue to offer a recently revised equitable and inclusive Award System. Our school has a long standing tradition of recognizing student excellence in athletic, artistic and academic achievement as well as making a positive difference in the school community. Staff and students will continue to moderate the implementation of the Award criteria we developed to ensure transparency.

Positive and Healthy Climate

This year we continue to promote a Positive and Healthy Climate for working and learning by continuing to offer a variety of extracurricular activities aimed at engaging a large number of students. Our Staff collaborate to implement a proactive and restorative approach to discipline that hinges on a strong parent-school partnership. We will also continue to track student attendance following our Absence Protocol. We appreciate your support in ensuring that students come to school regularly and ready to learn. As a learning community, we believe in early intervention, and a proactive and progressive discipline approach. IMMUNIZATION DATES AT GREENBRIAR M.S. 2019-2020 (Grade 7 and 8 students)

For the 2019-2020 school year, students will be immunized with Hepatitis B, Human Papillomavirus Virus (HPV), and Meningococcal vaccines.

Immunization against meningococcal virus is required for students to stay in school. Immunization against Hep B and HPV is voluntary, and recommended.

Please note: In order to support student privacy, Peel board students are encouraged to be mindful of how and when they use their school email (studentnumber@pdsb.net) to create accounts on any third party, non-protected domain, apps/web services.

The terms and conditions of these app/web-services may not align with the Peel board's Registering and Use of Software, Web-Based Services and Apps guidelines as their services may collect and display the student's private information, including the full name, publicly.

If your child uses their own personal accounts to access these apps/web services, please encourage them to use privacy settings to ensure that their account information, including full name, is not shared publicly.

Student Safety

Protect your kids — and your finances

The Peel District School Board does **not** provide accident insurance coverage for student injuries that occur on school property or during school activities including extracurricular sports. Each year, families could spend thousands of dollars when their children are injured at school, on field trips, while participating in non-school activities, or at home. If a student is injured, parent(s)/guardian(s) are responsible for any medical costs not covered by provincial health care or their employer's health care plan.

The provincial health care system does **not** cover costs which are commonly related to accidents including dental work, ambulance fees, casts and crutches, and physiotherapy. All of these **are** covered by Insuremykids student accident insurance plan and as a convenience to parents, the Board has arranged to offer a plan to parents through Old Republic Insurance Company of Canada. To help protect your family, it is strongly recommended that you consider obtaining Insuremykids Protection Plan, which offers a variety of benefits at affordable prices, which provide 24 hours a day, 365 days a year coverage, range from \$13 to \$33 per year.

The insurance agreement is between **You** and **Reliable Life Insurance Company**.

Getting your questions answered

If you have any questions, concerns or suggestions about your child's education, or about education in general, anyone with the Peel board is happy to help. Here are some of the people who can help you:

If you have specific questions or concerns about the education of your son or daughter, the first person to talk to is your child's teacher. If possible, arrange a personal interview with the teacher to discuss your concerns and attempt to resolve the matter. Your child's teacher or principal can also give you more information about specific strategies being used to monitor your child's progress.

If you need extra help, or have more general questions, your school principal is there to assist. Your school principal can help if you have been unable to resolve the issue with your child's teacher. All curriculum material is available in your child's school.

If you still have unanswered questions or concerns, talk to your superintendent of education.

If you have questions about special education programs or services, contact Special Education Support Services at 905-890-1010 ext. 2345.

What you need to know about busing

Peel District School students may access transportation services if their primary address is within the school's attendance boundary, at a distance of more than:

- kindergarten and grade 1 students – 1 km
- grades 2 to 4 students – 1.6 km
- grades 5 to 8 students – 2 km
- grades 9 to 12 students – 3.8 km

Eligibility distances are calculated using appropriate roadways and pedestrian walkways and are measured from home property line to school property line using Board approved software to ensure a consistent and equitable assessment of distance for all students and all schools within the Board. It is also important to note that parents are responsible for safely getting their children to and from school.

How do I know if my child is eligible for transportation?

Student Transportation of Peel Region (STOPR) has a website, www.stopr.ca, where you can find information concerning transportation including bus safety, procedures, late buses, cancellations, and frequently asked questions and as well whether your child is eligible for transportation based on your home address. Click on "Am I Eligible for Transportation" and enter your information. In addition, if your child is eligible for transportation, beginning the last week of August to the end of June each year, at www.stopr.ca you can securely access your child's specific transportation information, including bus stop location and pick-up and drop-off times. Click on "Parent/Student Login" and enter the information required. To ensure privacy of information you will be required to enter the Ontario Education Number (OEN), which can be found on your child's report card.

Parents can now sign-up to receive automatic e-mail notifications of delays or cancellations for their children's bus run. Go to www.stopr.ca and click on the "bus delays and cancellations" link and then click "subscriptions" to sign-up for this service.

Procedures help keep students safe at school

Student Safety

Dear Families,

Peel schools provide a safe environment for students and staff to learn and work. The board has many procedures to ensure safety ³/₄ including regular fire drills, evacuation plans, criminal record checks for new staff and volunteers, and lockdown, bomb threat protocol, hold and secure and shelter in place drills. Together with Peel Police, OPP and the Dufferin-Peel Catholic School Board, the board developed procedures for critical situations.

In accordance with the Ministry of Education, the Peel board worked together with Peel Regional Police, Ontario Provincial Police and school boards in the **Peel region to develop protocols for critical situations including bomb threats, lockdowns, hold and secure, shelter in place** in order to help keep schools safe during a potentially serious or violent incident.

Every school will review the key points of the lockdown process with students. We rehearse the drill twice per year to make sure staff and students know what to do if we have to initiate a lockdown.

During the rehearsal, the principal will make an announcement to "initiate lockdown procedure." The school bell will ring continuously for a period of time and our goal is to make the school appear vacated.

Students and staff *inside* the school will:

go to the closest room, close the door and lock it, if possible
turn off the lights and lie down on the floor away from doors and windows
remain on the floor quietly until further directions are given

Students and staff *outside* the school will:

move as far away from the building as possible
remain outside until further directions are given

Depending on the situation, students and staff *outside* the building may be directed to an evacuation site. When the rehearsal is over, the principal will make another announcement.

Important things to note when an emergency occurs

Students and staff must not use cell phones

In these critical situations, safety is our number one priority. During rehearsals or in real critical situations, Peel Police have advised that cell phone usage can cause more safety risks and the following consequences:

- Cause signal delays for emergency services to attend to the situation.
- Prevents police from being able to communicate with each other and other important personnel in a timely manner.
- Public posts and messages may identify where individuals are in the building and pose a safety risk.
- Can attract attention to the area of the school where the phone is being used.

Parents are requested to NOT call the school or your child's cell phone during emergency procedures.

Parents can get updates during emergency procedures on their school website

Parents are requested NOT to go to the school

In the unlikely event of an actual lockdown, hold and secure, shelter in place or bomb threat, police ask that parents do not go to the school. For safety reasons, you will not be allowed to enter a school that is in lockdown, hold and secure or shelter in place and students and staff cannot leave the school. In rare cases, police will designate a Parent Information Site for you to attend and get up-to-date, accurate information. **Please monitor your child's school website and do not come to the school unless requested to do so.**

If you have any questions about our lockdown drill, or any of the procedures we have in place to keep students and staff safe, please call the school.

Student Safety

Bomb Threat Protocol

Principals work with their staff to establish an agreed upon site specific bomb threat plan to be followed in the event of a bomb threat. The police will always be involved in the evaluation and response strategy to the receipt of a bomb threat.

Peel schools will rehearse drill for bomb threat or suspicious device/substance this fall.

Schools will review key points of the bomb threat process with students and will initiate a drill once per year, in the fall, to ensure that staff and students know what to do in the event of a real bomb threat or suspicious device/substance.

A "Communicate" message will be sent to families the day before the Bomb Threat Drill Rehearsal.

During the rehearsal, students *inside* the school will remain with or return to their supervising teacher immediately. Students are requested to turn off their cell phones during these emergency procedures. **Police have advised that cell phone usage can cause more safety risks and danger than benefits.**

Students and staff *outside* the school are requested to move as far away from the building as possible and remain outside until further directions are given and the rehearsal is complete.

The safety of our students is our top priority. Visit the "Safe Schools" page on the school website to learn more about the emergency procedures in place to keep students and staff safe. If you have any questions, please contact the school principal.

Keeping lunches and snacks peanut-free

Anaphylaxis is a potentially life-threatening allergic reaction that affects some children. We ask that you help us take care of these students by sending lunches and snacks for your child that are free from peanuts or nuts, because these foods are the leading cause of anaphylaxis.

Please read the label of any food you plan to send to school with your child. If the label says, "May contain nuts or peanuts," **please do not send it to school.**

Likewise, avoid sending "treats" to school to celebrate special occasions. Possible alternatives, would be making a donation to our Library or Breakfast Club.

How to register at a Peel school

Here's what you need to know about registering your child for school

Who can attend?

The Peel board serves children age 4 and older.

Our schools

Peel has more than 253 elementary and secondary schools. You can find the name and location of your local school by calling our Planning and Accommodation department at 905-890-1010 or 1-800-668-1146, extension 2212.

Where to register

If your family is new to Canada, your child may need an orientation interview to register for school. To assist you with registration, we offer three Welcome Centres. Please call 905-366-8791 to talk to our staff and book your appointment. There is no fee for registration.

Documents to bring to registration

Proof of child's age (provide one) : Canadian birth certificate, Canadian passport , citizenship card/certificate, Permanent Resident Card, Record of Landing, confirmation of permanent residence, work permit ,refugee permit

Proof of address (provide one) : purchase agreement, utility bill , bank statement/client slip (directly from financial institution) credit card statement , federal government forms (e.g. Social Insurance Number, Service Canada documents) ,Ontario driver's licence

Proof of custody – children must live with their parent(s) unless provided documentation supports an alternate living arrangement

Proof of immunization – proof that your child has been immunized/vaccinated

Missing documents?

If you are missing some documents, you can still visit the We Welcome the World Centres, and our staff will help you with all registration requirements.

Peel board trustees - accountable to the community

What

Keep students safe in school parking lots

Many elementary schools offer a Kiss N' Ride program, where parents/guardians can drop off and pick up their children at a designated area on school property. The program was established to provide a convenient and safe option for our students and parents driving to school. To ensure the safety of staff and students, we ask all parents/guardians be mindful of the following guidelines:

There is no parking and no waiting in the Kiss and Ride lane. Pay attention to the traffic in front of you and pull forward as cars move forward. If you choose to park in the parking lot, please escort your child to or from the nearest foot patroller and use the main crosswalk.

Vehicles entering the Kiss N' Ride lane must stay in the designated lane, unless otherwise directed by a staff member or volunteer.

The Kiss N' Ride program is only available to students who are able to disembark independently.

Have your child ready to exit the car when you reach the curb. Students may only exit from the passenger (right) side of the vehicle.

After picking up or dropping off your child, leave promptly so that others can get in behind you.

If your child is not waiting for you at the main crosswalk at the end of the day, please circle the parking lot if permitted and rejoin the line or park in a designated parking space to wait.

Always respect traffic flow and abide all traffic laws and signs.

Ask your child's teacher or principal to learn more about our school's specific Kiss N' Ride procedures.

Safe Arrival System

Will allow you to report your child (ren)'s absences quickly and conveniently in one of three ways:

- 2) Log into a website **pdsb.schoolconnects.com** to access SafeArrival /Parent Portal
- 3) You can download the Safe Arrival mobile application for Apple and Android devices

Permission to "go out for lunch"

Greenbriar MS provides a supervised area for lunch. Students are encouraged to bring a nutritious lunch and remain on school property unless parents have signed a consent form for their children to eat away from Greenbriar.

To ensure your child safety, please be consistent with your expectation that your child regularly remains at school OR regularly leaves the school.

Daily "notes" authorizing students to leave the school building at lunch will be accepted only in rare and exceptional circumstances.
