Important Application Dates for Ontario College Programs Beginning Fall 2020:

Information	Date
Access to the online college application at www.ontariocolleges.ca begins. Apply to OCAS now so that you can get a head start on completing the application. Subsequent application requirements may include a Student Profile Form, portfolio, testing, questionnaires/essays, letters of reference, etc. Apply to Highly Competitive Programs	October 2019
Applications received and paid for on or before this date will be equal consideration	February 1, 2020
You must confirm your acceptance of an offer of admission by this date	May 1, 2020
Earliest date that colleges may require payment of tuition fees	Mid-June, 2020

Application Deadline for College Programs: Monday February 1, 2020

Application fee is \$95. Pay online at OCAS

Maximum **5 programs** may be selected. (Limit of 3 at any one college)

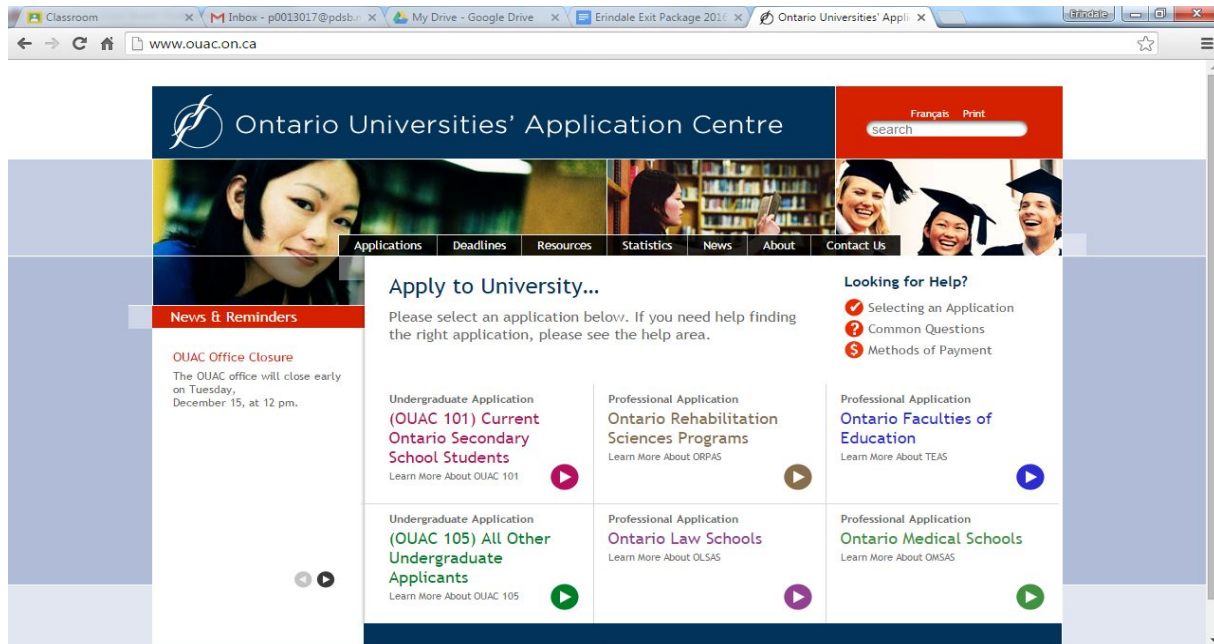

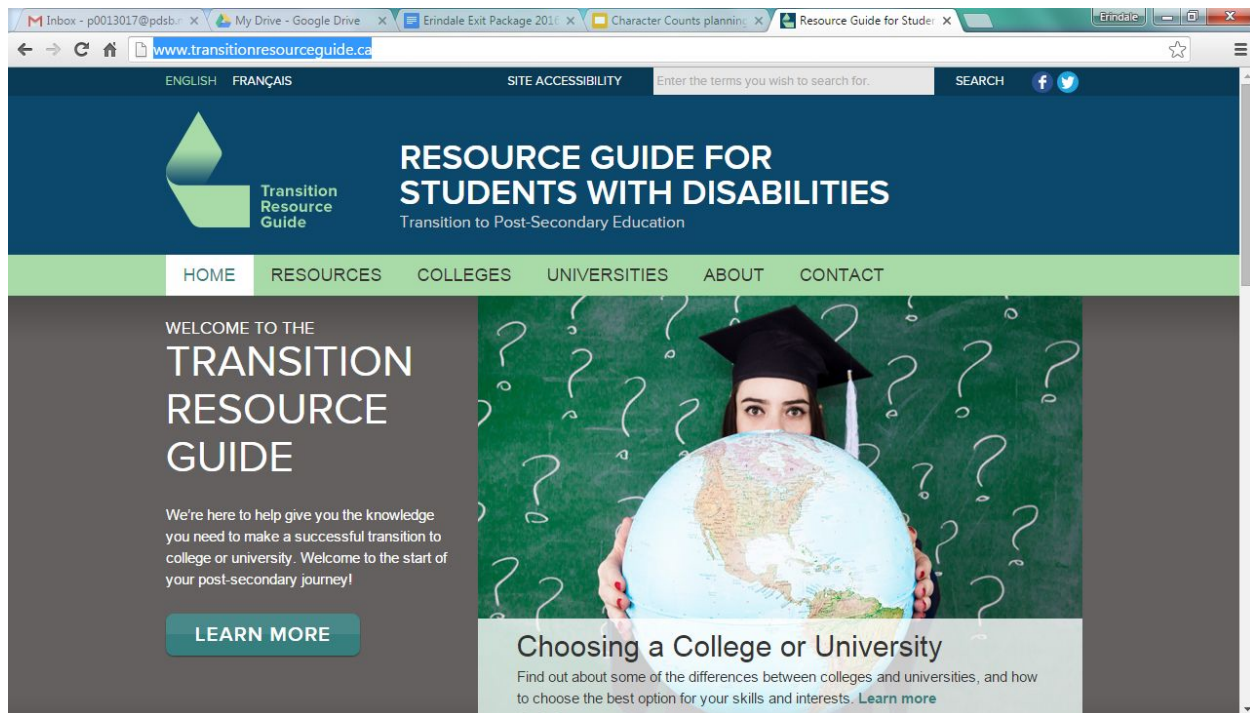
