- Work towards independent work habits required for senior level study and college.
- Texts will be read independently.
- Learn formal debate protocol.
- Learn how to write a monologue to demonstrate diverse perspectives
- Participation is a daily requirement of the course as are small group and independent presentations with an AV component.
- Media component will focus on techniques for reading graphical text and camera techniques in movies.
- Further develop the writing process when producing supported opinion paragraphs and a series of written paragraphs.
