

Canadian History since WW1, Grade 10 - Applied CHC 2P0

This course focuses on the social context of historical developments and events and how they have affected the lives of people in Canada since 1914. Students will explore interactions between various communities in Canada as well as contributions of individuals and groups to Canadian heritage and identity. Students will develop their ability to research and critically analyze various sources of historical information when investigating the continuing relevance of historical developments and how they have helped to shape communities in contemporary Canada.

Skills that will be developed:

- The ability to apply the historical inquiry process through a critical thinking lens in order to investigate and reach conclusions about historical issues, developments, and events.
- Through various stages, students will learn how to properly compose persuasive paragraphs.

Assignments:

- Students will identify and choose three defining events in Canadian history and creatively demonstrate and argue how these events contribute to the development of the Canadian identity.
- Students will construct three individual artefacts that provide the student the ability to demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of their choice of Canada's defining moments.
