

**Canadian and International Law, Grade 12 – University Preparation  
CLN 4U0**

This course explores a range of contemporary legal issues and how they are addressed in both Canadian and international law. Students will develop their understanding of the principles of Canadian and international law when exploring rights and freedoms within the context of topics such as religion, security, cyberspace, immigration, crimes against humanity, and environmental protection. Students will apply the concepts of legal thinking and the legal inquiry process when investigating these issues in both Canadian and international contexts, and they will develop legal reasoning skills and an understanding of conflict resolution in the area of international and domestic law. Assessments may include collective bargaining and human right tribunal simulations, debates, written profiles, tests, presentations and essays. Strong reading and writing skills are beneficial as is the ability to learn collaboratively.
