

Introduction to Anthropology, Psychology, and Sociology, Grade 11 – University Preparation

This course provides students with opportunities to think critically about theories, questions, and issues related to anthropology, psychology, and sociology. Students will develop an understanding of the approaches and research methods used by social scientists. They will be given opportunities to explore theories from a variety of perspectives, to conduct social science, and to become familiar with current thinking on a range of issues including racism, personality development, deviance, evolution, gender, cults, neurology etc. within the three disciplines. Assessments may include panel debates, research, case studies, tests, presentations and experiments.

Prerequisite: Grade 10 Academic English (ENG 2D) or Grade 10 Academic Canadian History (CHC 2D)
