

Canadian History, Grade 10 – Academic (ESL)
CHC 2DL

This course is only available to students taking ESL AO, ESL BO, ESL CO, and ESL DO.

This academic course explores the social, political and economic events and their impact on the people of Canada since 1914. Students will examine the role of conflict and cooperation within Canadian society, Canada's evolving position within the global community and their impact on the development of the Canadian identity. Students will develop an ability to effectively apply the concepts of historical thinking to the analysis and interpretation of evidence when investigating key issues and defining moments in Canadian history since 1914.

Skills that will be developed:

- The ability to apply the historical inquiry process through a critical thinking lens in order to investigate and reach conclusions about historical issues, developments, and events.
- Through various stages, students will learn how to properly compose a persuasive historical essay.

Assignments:

- Students will identify and choose three defining events in Canadian history and creatively demonstrate and argue how these events contribute to the development of the Canadian identity.
- Students will construct three individual artefacts that provide the student the ability to demonstrate their knowledge and understanding of their choice of Canada's defining moments.
