

**Canadian History Since World War I (Grade 10 – Open, ESL)
CHC 2PL**

This course is only available to students taking ESL AO, ESL BO, ESL CO, and ESL DO.

This course focuses on Canada's social, cultural, and political developments since the first World War. For the ELL, it provides essential context about the evolving Canadian identity which they will actively continue to form and reform. Further, this course introduces students to complex thinking skills and processes through historical investigation that will be applicable in continued academic study and in their everyday lives. This includes the ability to analyse an issue, especially with consideration of various perspectives, causal relationships, significance, and development. Course instruction and delivery will build upon students' previous language skills and include exercises in speaking, listening, reading, and writing. Engagement with historical sources provides opportunities to employ reading strategies, link and organize written ideas, and develop the essential cultural knowledge that will help students understand, interpret, and adapt to their new environment.

By the end of this course, students will be able to:

- Use a process of historical inquiry and concepts of historical thinking to deepen their understanding of Canada and the world
- Describe key events, interactions and individuals that have affected Canadians
Identify and explain key patterns and trends in history for the purpose of forming and supporting conclusions
