

Advanced Learning Strategies: Skills for Success after Secondary School, Grade 11 - Open GLE 300

This course is only for students who have an IEP.

Students will learn how to develop and apply a range of strategies to improve their learning and achievement, particularly their literacy, numeracy, communication, and planning skills. This course will look at how to begin to make a successful transition to a chosen pathway after high school. GLE 300 also examines how to be successful in senior high school courses and begins to help students develop a plan for their post secondary pathway. Student will examine topics such as motivation, self-advocacy, differences between high school and post secondary institutions, financial planning and the world of work.
