## Welcome

## **Renovation Update**

The Woodlands School is looking like a new place! Over the summer much construction at the school has resulted in new flooring on the main floor, new bathrooms, a school elevator, new windows, a new elementary wing, and much more. As indicated in the Spring, the total renovation project will take a year and a half, so more work will be completed throughout the school year and into next summer. We ask that all students and parents continue to be patient as we work to beautify the school.

As a result of the renovation <u>please note that registration this year will take place at McBride Public School in the school's gymnasium.</u>
Students can access the gym on the west side of McBride (facing The Woodlands). Please be advised that the registration process involves the purchasing of activity packages and taking photos for student ID cards and the yearbook. As such, parents/guardians may wish to drop off and pick up their child on their allocated registration day. Note that grade 9 students are divided into two groups, by surname. Secondary students are asked to bring their negative media consent (if applicable) with them to registration.

## **Registration:**

During registration students will have their student identification/school photo taken, receive their timetable and submit a locker assignment form. Students will also have an opportunity to purchase a Student Activity Package.

The Student Activity Package allows students to participate in the following extra-curricular activities for the 2015-2016 school year: Student Council and Student Council supported activities, intramurals, numerous clubs, and the Arts. It also includes a 2015-2016 Student Agenda and a \$5.00 printing credit. The Student Activity Package supports student life at the school and keeps extra-curricular events and activities affordable for our school community.

#### Lockers:

All students will be provided with a shared locker and a school lock at no cost. Lockers are the property of the Peel District School Board and may be opened at any time by a member of the school administration and/or designate. Students are expected to keep their locker clean, free of garbage and graffiti, and in good condition at all times.

#### **Serious Medical Condition:**

If your son/daughter has a serious medical condition that requires medication to be kept at school (EpiPen, etc.) or if he/she requires other immediate medical interventions, please ensure that his/her Vice-Principal is made aware and that this information appears on the school records. Please contact a member of the front office staff for further assistance with this.

#### **How to Reach Us:**

The Woodlands School uses a voice mail system. If you need to speak with a member of the Office Staff press "0" at the voice mail prompt. Office staff will be available to answer phones daily between the hours of 8:00 am and 4:00 pm.

#### **Phones:**

A single pay phone is available in the gymnasium wing for student use. Students may receive additional assistance by going to Student Reception in the main office.

#### If You Need to Reach Your Child:

Unless it is an emergency, the office staff is unable to page students during school hours. If you must reach your child, please call the school and press "0" to reach Student Reception.

Parents/Guardians are urged to make all arrangements with their child before they leave for school.

NOTE: Course Change Request forms will be available during registration. Students have until Thursday, September 10 to submit Course Change Requests to the Main Office. Forms will not be accepted in Student Services. Students are asked to make sure ANY course change requests conform to the criteria listed at the top of the form. Only requests which meet the established criteria will be considered.

#### Student Assistance/Resources:

The Special Education Department is excited to embark on another successful academic year. Come visit our Contact Room at our new location on the main floor where we will run programs to support students both socially and emotionally.

New to The Woodlands this year is our Resource Lounge, also located on the main floor. Come work with our amazing staff to help support you with your academics or providing you with an alternative learning space! Looking forward to another great year!

#### **Student Absences:**

Regular attendance and punctuality is an expectation and supports student success. Parents / Guardians are asked to call the school or send a note to the school to explain all absences and late arrivals to school.

All students leaving school for the day must sign out. Students under the age of 18 must have parental permission to sign out of school. Students not returning from lunch must arrange for parental contact with the school.

All vacations should be arranged to take place during the designated holiday periods. Parents/Guardians put their child's academic success at risk when leaves of absence are planned outside the designated holiday periods.

#### **Parent Web:**

Parent Web gives Parents/Guardians Internet access to The Woodlands / Peel District School Board attendance system. Parents/Guardians need to register on our website, complete and submit an authorization form from the school, and can then use the system to monitor and/or check their son/daughter's attendance at any time.

## **Security Cameras:**

The Woodlands School has a security camera system. Surveillance by the security cameras ensures that our school is a safe place for students to learn.

#### Food Brought to School:

There are several students at our school with severe or life-threatening allergies to peanuts, nuts and other foods. We ask that you help care for these students by choosing lunches and snacks for your child that are nut-free.
